Sidebar - Cherub/Cherubim and Seraph/Seraphim

- These are multi-form animal creatures who are portrayed in the Bible as guardians of God's throne room.
- No one in the Bible ever meets cherubim in day-to-day life, and they are not the same as angels who can cross between the spiritual and human realms.
- Cherubim are only ever seen by prophets who have dreams or visions of the heavenly throne room of God.
- Cherubim are first mentioned in the Bible as guardians of God's space in Eden where heaven and earth overlap. Genesis 3:24.
- Some have "two wings" and some have "four wings."

The role of the Cherubim

 The cherubim play the role of throne room, the choir praising the King, and the supporters or carriers of the divine throne. In Isaiah's vision, he sees into the heavenly throne room and describes creatures with "," and he calls them ""
Seraph/Seraphim: This is one of the main Hebrew words for, particularly venomous ones (see Numbers 21:6, Deuteronomy 8:15, and Isaiah 14:29).
'Seraph" means to Seraphim are described as having faces, hands, and feet (this is an) and are powerful creatures that do God's will.
They appear to be involved with God and are in proximity to his throne.
